What Addictions Does United Recovery Project Treat?

The term 'drug addiction' can refer to a range of substance use disorders. For instance, one of the most common addictions today is the addiction to opioid medications. In fact, the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration estimates that over 1.6 million people across the country had an addiction to opioids in 2019. Doctors and medical experts often prescribe opioids and opiates to help patients deal with pain after major surgery or injuries. Unfortunately, long-term use of opioids can lead to tolerance, meaning that the patient must take more of the medication to get the same effect. Furthermore, their brains quickly become dependent on the drug, which leads them to develop withdrawal symptoms when they miss a dose.

- · Prescription medications



Close to 21.6 million people needed treatment for substance abuse.


However, only 4.2 million people sought treatment.


Therapeutic Options At Our Treatment Center
